Course Format

This course meets for three- and four-day segments during two consecutive summers. Each day begins at 9 a.m. and ends at 5 p.m. with a one-hour lunch break.

Lunch, water, coffee and tea, and light snacks are provided throughout the course.

Course Description

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a practice of religious formation for children based on the educational method of Dr. Maria Montessori. CGS seeks to prepare a sacred, "hands-on" space for children called an atrium, in which both children and their catechists can hear, ponder, and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Christian faith as revealed in the Scriptures and Liturgy.

Originally developed in Rome by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi beginning seventy years ago, CGS continues to spread worldwide and is used with adaptations in various Christian traditions.

This formation course is sponsored by the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGSUSA). Upon the participant's completion of the course and its requirements, he or she will receive Level II Catechist Certification.

Course Objectives

• To explore with participants the unique development and religious characteristics of the six- to nine-year-old child, including his or her relation to Sacramental Preparation

- To meditate further on the biblical and liturgical themes of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) in a manner appropriate for the child's second plane of development
- To offer guidelines for preparing an atrium for six- to nine-year-old children, writing an album, and making materials
- To deepen the participant's ability to observe and learn from children, and to explore avenues for helping one's parish or school community to do the same
